- 1-To study language in discourse is to study language in use.
- 2-To study language in discourse is to account of how social interaction is achieved 'by reference not only to rules of usage.....but also to rules of...use, which provide for the way language is realized as a means fo communication'
- 3-This outlines the idea of moving from an almost exclusive concern with formal grammatical analysis to an outweighed concern with functions (acts) without excluding knowledge from the first level.
- 4- Language is, thus, to be looked at holistically (linguistic, notional, functional, communicative, cultural, etc)
- 5-Language occurs in an ethnographic context.
- 6-So, in addition to rules of usage (cohesion), discourse analysis includes the study of those rules of use and processes wherby meanings are created and interpreted (coherence).
